Peace movements and national government representatives will discuss together the tasks facing us now for promotion of the signing/ratification of the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons and toward the NPT Review Conference of 2020

Special Meeting (13:00-16:00): Achieving a Nuclear-Free and Bases-Free Japan; Solidarity with Okinawa

Achieving a nuclear-free, bases-free Okinawa and cancellation of the construction of a new US base at Henoko is the task for the entire Japanese people. In solidarity with the "All Okinawan Struggle", participants will discuss how to broaden and strengthen the movement to achieve the goal.

Workshops (09:30-15:00): (At various venues throughout Nagasaki City; Some workshops run with different time schedule)

For a Nuclear Weapon-Free, Peaceful World - Action from the Grass-roots

Discussion will focus on how to step up the grass-roots mobilization for 2020, the 75th year of the atomic bombing, together with the anti-nuclear peace movement from around the world. Participants are invited to discuss exchange views on their campaigns on the Hibakusha Appeal signature collection, Peace March and other grass-roots experiences.

2. Nuclear weapon-free and peaceful Northeast Asia and Role to be played by Japan

The denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula is the focal point of the East Asia. Given that no agreement was reached in the 2nd US-DPRK summit, the broad current for the denuclearization is maintained. The workshop will discuss the immediate tasks for us, especially the role to be played by Japan.

3. Creating nuclear-free and peace-oriented local municipalities

Already 60% of Japanese mayors have signed the "International Hibakusha Appeal" and 374 municipal assemblies have adopted resolutions urging the Japanese government to sign and ratify the TPNW. The workshop will discuss how to create and strengthen nuclear-free and peace-oriented local administrations which will reflect the desire of local citizens for peace and against nuclear weapons.

4. Achieving Nuclear-Free, Peaceful Japan by Defending Article 9 of Japan's Constitution

Article 9 of Japan's Constitution embodies the painful lesson from the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The workshop will discuss people's cooperation and campaigns to block the revision of Article 9 and urge Japan to join the TPNW. Sharing people's experiences on the "International Hibakusha Appeal" and "30 Million People" signature campaign, the participants will explore future actions for achieving a nuclear-free and peaceful Japan.

5. Inheriting and making the A-bomb experiences known to the world; Supporting and working together in solidarity with the Hibakusha

The workshop will discuss and exchange opinions about the activities to support the Hibakusha in solidarity with them toward 2020, the 75th anniversary of the atomic bombing. Participants will listen directly to the witnesses of the Hibakusha. Other topics of discussion will include how to hold and spread the A-bomb exhibitions in Japan and internationally. The 2nd and 3rd generation Hibakusha will share their efforts to organize themselves and help making Hibakusha's experiences known to the people. Victims of nuclear tests/development will be invited to speak, too.

6. Nuclear weapons and nuclear power plants

Though 8 years have passed since the disaster of the TEPCO Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant, the lessons of the disaster are not learned and nuclear power plants are restarting their operations on after another. The workshop will again make clear the responsibility of the TEPCO and the government, and share the victims' struggles and people's efforts and experiences to support them, as well as efforts to abolish nuclear power plants and shift to renewable energy sources.

7. Reduction of military spending to achieve peace and decent life of the people

In December 2018 Abe government decided on the "National Defense Program Guidelines for FY 2019 and beyond" and "Medium Term Defense Plan" which means for the next 5 years, Japan will spend 27.5 trillion yen to buy enormous amount of U.S. weapons and systems. The participants will explore how to achieve decent life, economy and safety of the nation and spread the base for expanding the anti-nuclear peace movement by refusing the massive armament program of the country

8. Broadening culture of anti-nuclear peace

Without the non-violent struggles of the Hibakusha, a path for the elimination of nuclear weapons would not have been opened. The participants will discuss together how to create a culture of peace in the current world full of serious problems and issues, and find ways to hand the world over to future generations, by learning from the Hibakusha's culture.

9. Youth Forum: Visiting the Hibakusha, learning and exchange

This is a workshop for, and by the young people trying to become main players to create a nuclear weapon-free world by inheriting Hibakusha's experiences and struggles. In small groups participants will listen to Hibakusha's stories or go on a field work to relive the experiences of the hibakusha.

10. Learning Hiroshima & Nagasaki through films

Participants will view the films on the history of the movement against A & H Bombs and the inhumanity of nuclear weapons and discuss how to make best use of these visual materials in the peace movement and campaigns.
